## Submissions

The journal's Editorial Board is responsible for deciding whether the manuscript should be accepted, returned for revision, or rejected. During the review process, all communication will be between the Editorial Board and the corresponding author. Authors will receive a final decision e-mail message from the Editorial Board.

Manuscripts must be submitted as .doc or .rtf (for text), .jpg, .tif or .eps files (for illustrations). These are the files that will be used for production of the final published version of your paper.

Manuscripts should be submitted by e-mail to biohorizons@leeds.ac.uk.

You must have your final submission signed off by your supervisor before you submit your paper to us — both when initially submitting your paper, and prior to submitting a revised submission (if applicable). Note that getting feedback from your supervisor on your submission does not count as co-authorship. Therefore, you are encouraged to seek advice from your supervisor during the writing of your submission.

### Previous publication

Submission of a manuscript implies that it reports unpublished work, that it is not under consideration for publication elsewhere and that, if accepted, it will not be published elsewhere in the same form, either in English or in any other language, without the consent of the publisher.

The journal will consider publication of work that has previously been presented as either a short abstract or poster at a conference, **but not as a full paper**. If previously published tables, illustrations or more than 200 words of text are to be included, then the copyright holder's written permission must be obtained. Include copies of any such permission letters with your paper.

### Licence to publish

It is a condition of publication in *Bioscience Horizons* that authors grant an exclusive licence to Oxford University Press. This ensures that requests from third parties to reproduce articles are handled efficiently and consistently and will also allow the article to be as widely disseminated as possible. The author copyright licence form is available from [www.biohorizons.oxfordjournals.org](http://www.biohorizons.oxfordjournals.org) and should be signed and submitted immediately upon acceptance. As part of the licence agreement, authors may use their own material in other publications provided that *Bioscience Horizons* is acknowledged as the original place of publication and Oxford University Press as the publisher.

### Types of contribution

Contributions, which must be in good English, should be submitted for potential inclusion in one of the following sections:

#### Research Articles

The main text must be no more than 5000 (excluding references and tabular content) words and should comprise:

- Abstract (not exceeding 350 words)
- Introduction: this section should specifically state the scientific question within the context of the field of study.
- Materials and Methods
- Results: this section should summarize the scientific advance or novel results of the study
- Discussion (can be combined with Results)
- Conclusion (if needed)
- Acknowledgements: these should be included at the end of the text and not in footnotes.
- References

### Reviews

Papers submitted as Reviews to *Bioscience Horizons* should be original reviews of the literature, which may be of general interest to a broad biosciences audience. The scientific content communicated may be original or may address findings published in other journals. The main body of the text, including all figure legends, must not exceed 5000 words. References do not count towards this word limit.

### Other requirements

Permission to reproduce copyright material, for print and online publication in perpetuity, must be cleared. Evidence in writing that such permissions have been secured from the rights-holder must be made available to the Editorial Board. It is also the author's responsibility to include acknowledgements as stipulated by the particular institutions.
